RIOR to the organizing of the Alumni Association in 1922, there were sixty-six graduates of the Union School at South New Berlin. Ida Wall Butts and Elsie VanValkenburg Isbell were members of the first graduating class in 1894. They are now deceased. Many of the Alumni of the period between 1894-1922 are living.

It was during this school year of 1922-1923 and through the initiative and efforts of the then principal, George G. Preston, and the preceding classes that the Alumni Association of the South New Berlin school was instituted. A school annual was published. This class was proud of their annual or class book because of its being the first annual published by this school.

When this class graduated it was not from a full four year high school. During the ensuing years, the same principal Mr. Preston, with the initiative, effort, and caring for the school and community succeeded in raising the school to a full four-year high school rating.

From 1922 to 1972 a total of six hundred seventy-one young men and women have graduated and it is about this group that this fiftieth year Alumni Anniversary booklet has been written.

The following manuscripts have been submitted by various alumni. Much time, research and work has been spent on this project. If any alumnus is missing or any information is incorrect, it is because records were incomplete or it was impossible to acquire more information.

MINUTES OF THE FIRST ALUMNI MEETING - 1922

The first meeting of South New Berlin High School Alumni Association was held at the close of commencement exercises Wednesday evening, June 28, 1922 in the Methodist-Episcopal Community House. There were about fifty present.

Professor C. S. Gibson of Syracuse and Superintendent Bowers of New Berlin were speakers of the evening.

Each alumnus was asked to express in his words what an association of South New Berlin High School would mean to him.

It was decided to form an association and the following officers were elected: President—Paul Hickling, Vice-President—Normina Hile, Secretary-Treasurer—Kenneth Coy.











Reminiscing about the class of 1933, it will be remembered that this was the last class to be graduated from the old South New Berlin School before it, along with all its records, pictures and mementoes, burned to the ground in early 1934, on the coldest day of the winter. It is sure that only material things were destroyed, as memories of the friendships, sports and activities in those early years always remain for those who graduated before this year.

The only two boys in the class of '33 became very successful in their chosen professions but unfortunately have passed away at this time. John Hayes, after having his own law practice, became attorney for the Norwich Pharmacal Company. He had one son. 


















